

Dominique Njinkeu, a national of Cameroon, is the Executive Director of ILEAP and worked previously for the African Economic Research Consortium (AERC) in Nairobi, Kenya as the Deputy Director of Research. He also held research positions at the council for the Development of Social Science Research in Africa (CODESRIA) in Dakar, Senegal, and the Government of Cameroon. He has taught at the University of Yaoundé in Cameroon, the Université Laval, Quebec, and at Southern Illinois University Carbondale. He holds a MSc in Agribusiness Economics, a double major MSc in Statistics and Economics, and a Ph.D. in Economics from Southern Illinois University Carbondale.

Dr. Njinkeu has research and published on African development issues, trade and regional integration, and international negotiations. He has published widely on African economic policy issues with emphasis on trade and regional integration. His most recent contribution to the literature include editor or co-editor of books such as *L'Afrique et les défis de l'OMC* (2004, Karthala); *Africa in the World Trading System: Case Studies Volume 2* (2007, Africa World Press); *The Political Economy of Economic Growth in Africa, 1960-2000* (due in 2007, Cambridge University Press); *African Countries in the New Trade Negotiations* (to be published in early 2008); and *Aid for Trade and Development* (2007, Cambridge University Press). His work draws extensively on over 15 years of doing research and advising African governments and regional economic communities on trade and regional integration.
