

PROGRAM ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
JOHN A. LOGAN COLLEGE
CARTERVILLE, ILLINOIS
AND
SOUTHERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY AT CARBONDALE
CARBONDALE, ILLINOIS

In an effort to provide a continued, articulated computer systems technologies higher education baccalaureate degree program that will build on community college and university learning experiences, and also eliminate duplication of instruction, this agreement is set forth between John A. Logan College and the Board of Trustees of Southern Illinois University on behalf of Southern Illinois University at Carbondale (SIUC).

1. All graduates of John A. Logan College with majors listed below will receive preferential admission status into SIUC's Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Information Systems Technologies (IST) program in the College of Applied Sciences and Arts upon application to SIUC:

- a. AAS in Computer Information Systems
- b. AAS in Office Supervision & Management with Computer Specialty (transferable English is required addition--see No. 2a and 5)
- c. AAS in Office Supervision & Management with Accounting Specialty (transferable English and Programming I are required additions--see No. 2b and 5)
- d. AAS in Office Supervision & Management with Marketing Specialty (transferable English and Programming I are required additions--see No. 2b and 5)

2. A John A. Logan College graduate receiving an AAS Degree in one of the four majors listed above with additions noted in 1b, 1c, and 1d and earning an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.25 on a 4.0 scale as calculated by the University's grading regulations at the time of receiving the degree is eligible for the Capstone Option for admission to SIUC's IST program.

- a. Students transferring from John A. Logan's AAS in Office Supervision and Management with Computer Specialty must take transferrable English in order to be eligible for the Capstone Option.
- b. Please note that students transferring from John A. Logan College's AAS in Office Supervision and Management with the Accounting and/or Marketing Specialty must take Programming I at John A. Logan in addition to the transferable English (see No. 5) in order to be eligible for the Capstone Option.

Capstone Option guarantees the AAS degree recipient in the four programs above with noted additions for three programs (1b, 1c, and 1d) that the IST degree can be completed with a total of no more than 60 semester hours of work at SIUC. John A. Logan College students must complete the SIUC Capstone Application (separate from the admissions application) to be considered for admission under this option.

3. Those John A. Logan College graduates receiving an AAS degree in one of the

above majors with less than an overall 2.25 GPA, but with an overall GPA of 2.0 to 2.24 will be eligible for preferential admission to IST. However, such students will be required to take not more than 82 semester hours of work at SIUC, including a combination of IST major course work and university core curriculum requirements.

4. John A. Logan College students transferring to the IST baccalaureate degree program at SIUC who have not completed all of their Associate of Applied Science Degree requirements at John A. Logan College will have their related course work evaluated on a case-by-case basis by the appropriate SIUC program. Every effort will be made within university, college and departmental guidelines to apply John A. Logan College related course work directly to SIUC major requirements in the IST degree.

5. Students transferring from John A. Logan College's AAS related programs to Information Systems Technologies program at SIUC must have already completed at least 12 hours of transferable University Core Curriculum (general education) credit at JAL. Students in the three AAS specialty areas in Office Supervision & Management (Accounting, Computer, and Marketing) must take transferable English in addition to BUS 135, Office Language Skills, in order to meet the requirements of SIUC's Capstone Option.

6. An SIUC IST representative will meet not less than once a year with John A. Logan College students planning to articulate to SIUC under this agreement for general advisement and degree planning purposes.

7. Upon successful completion of all degree requirements, and following all policies and regulations stated in the SIUC program and university guidelines, John A. Logan College students will be eligible to receive the Bachelor of Science degree in Information Systems Technologies, College of Applied Sciences and Arts, Southern Illinois University at Carbondale.

8. Should changes occur in course or program content, the school making the change agrees to notify the other school in writing so that this agreement can be re-evaluated. Notice of changes shall be given at least 45 days prior to the beginning of the semester when the change is implemented.

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
